AQUATICA WATER PARK

SAN ANTONIO

Aquatica is a stand-alone water park inside Sea World that boasts the tallest drop slide in Texas. You'll drop at an 80-degree angle from a tube after the floor is pulled out from underneath your feet. Families will find a mix of high-adrenaline rides with some more relaxing experiences, like a 400,000-gallon wave pool and a pool with a waterfall.

BIG RIVER WATER PARKS AND ADVENTURES

NEW CANEY

Families can make a wet and dry day in New Caney, as the water park is attached to Big River Fairgrounds, which includes carnival rides. While at the water park, older kids and adults can try Wild Isle, a water challenge course where guests can climb over walls and work their way through obstacles.

EPIC WATERS INDOOR WATERPARK

GRAND PRAIRIE

There is plenty of fun for everyone at Epic Water, which is the largest indoor park in Texas. The park, an 80,000-foot facility, has 11 water slides and a tipping bucket that unloads 300 gallons of water with each dump.



KALAHARI ROUND ROCK

ROUND ROCK

Kalahari is the biggest indoor resort water park in America. It was made for thrill-seekers with two high-profile rides that bring guests from across the country: "The Screaming Hyena" and "Tanzania Twist." The Hyena has a 60-foot slide that drops guests through the water park roof, and the Twist is a water ride that hurdles patrons down a funnel at 40 miles per hour.



HAWAIIAN FALLS ROANOKE

ROANOKE

With five locations in Texas, Hawaiian Falls is accessible to a wide range of residents. For thrill-seekers, the Roanoke site has MegaWaterWorld, billed as the world's largest aquatic play structure.



NRH2O FAMILY WATER PARK

NORTH RICHLAND HILLS

One of the most affordable water parks in Texas, NRH20 has the Tadpole Swimming Hole for young kids or Frogstein's Splashatory, a five-level interactive water playground. Older kids and adults will enjoy the Green Extreme and the Sidewinder, two thrilling water coasters.





SCHLITTERBAHN GALVESTON ISLAND WATERPARK

GALVESTON

According to Adventure Travel, Schlitterbahn is the world's best and biggest waterpark. Split into two sections — East and West — Schlitterbahn boasts 33 rides. Its marguee water slide, "The Master Blaster," features a six-story drop.

SIX FLAGS HURRICANE HARBOR

ARLINGTON

A park for thrill-seekers, the biggest adrenaline rush attraction is the Mega Wedge, an 83-foot wall for riders to slide down a vertical wall at 23 miles per hour. There is also a lazy river and a giant swimming pool for a slower pace.

TEXAS WATER RAMPAGE

LUBBOCK

Affordable for families, Texas Water Rampage has a 700-foot lazy river (Rio Rampage), a tidal wave pool with 4-foot waves and Twin Twisters, two 400-foot long body slides.

WET 'N' WILD WATERWORLD: ANTHONY

ANTHONY

Wet 'N' Wild boasts the biggest wave pool in Texas. Parents looking to escape the sun can enjoy a spot under the most shade of any park in Texas. Its biggest attraction is the Alien Vortex, a spinning speed slide for advanced swimmers only.


