We've compiled a list of 20 food banks across Texas that need volunteers, both in-person and virtually. You can sign up yourself, your family, or even a group of volunteers like a scout troop or church group to help out.

VIIP SERVICE

CENTRAL TEXAS BASTROP COUNTY EMERGENCY FOOD PANTRY

Serving Bastrop County, the Bastrop County Emergency Food Pantry dished out more than 457,000 pounds of food last year. The group also provides rent and utility assistance.

THE CARING PLACE

The Caring Place provides food and financial assistance to people in need in central Texas. You can also <u>donate</u> clothes, gently used toys and games, most kitchen supplies, small furniture, and medical equipment.

CARITAS OF AUSTIN

Devoted to the homeless population, Caritas of Austin has served more than 34,000 lunches and nearly 19,000 meals. Caritas also offers classes, provides assistance to veterans, and builds employment plans for each client.

CENTRAL TEXAS FOOD BANK

The largest hunger-relief charity in Central Texas, the Central Texas Food Bank delivered nearly 54 million meals last year. Volunteers can raise money, host food drives, or even help hands-on with the gardener.

CIRCLE OF HOPE COMMUNITY CENTER

Located in Pflugerville, Circle of Hope provides food, educational resources, and family assistance to people in need in Central Texas. <u>Volunteers</u> wishing to help with food distributions should be over the age of 16. The Circle of Hope food bank is open Monday-Friday from 10 a.m.-noon.

HAYS COUNTY FOOD BANK

A food assistance program in San Marcos, the Hays County Food Bank also provides food educational services. <u>Volunteers</u> are needed across all aspects of the food bank, from transportation to distribution to working at special events.

HILL COUNTY COMMUNITY MINISTRIES

Offering a food pantry, a fresh food delivery service and a thrift store, Hill County Community Ministries served nearly 28,000 people last year. Families looking to help can donate money, time, food, or items for the thrift store.

HOPE FOOD PANTRY

Providing groceries for those who experience food insecurity, Hope Food Pantry distributed groceries to 4,509 households in 2021. More than 25 volunteers are needed just for food distribution each week. Volunteers can stock shelves or help families during distribution.

HUTTO RESOURCE CENTER

A community center that offers job resources, access to food, and financial assistance for needy families. The center uses <u>volunteers</u> for distribution and job training. Families can also donate money yearly or each month, donate non-perishable items like toilet paper and diapers, or volunteer to host a drop-off location for food and other donations.

JOSEPH'S FOOD PANTRY

This faith-based pantry serves the Hill Country Area of Granite Shoals, Marble Falls, Kingsland and Burnet. The location also hosts an annual Thanksgiving Meal, needing volunteers the weekend before the holiday.

MICAH 6 OF AUSTIN

Micah 6 is a network of faith-based communities in and around the University of Texas. The service organization focuses on the homeless and impoverished in the area, including through ministry and at the food pantry. All <u>volunteers</u> must be at least 10 years old.

ROUND ROCK AREA SERVING CENTER

The center serves Round Rock with food resources, clothing and furniture vouchers and financial assistance. Volunteers are needed to distribute food on pantry days as well as collect items for distribution. Groups such as scouts and church groups are encouraged to volunteer.

SHEPHERD'S HEART

This faith-based organization provides food, clothing and basic assistance for people in need in the Taylor area. <u>Volunteers</u> are needed in the food pantry as well as the thrift shop.

THE HELPING CENTER OF MARBLE FALLS

Serving the needy in Southern Burnet County, The Helping Center is looking for volunteers to give time, money, and food. The center is served by more than 10 area churches, and it provides assistance to the elderly living on fixed incomes as well as survivors of domestic abuse.

TRAVIS COUNTY COMMUNITY CENTERS

(Downtown Austin, Del Valle, Manor, South Austin, Jonestown, Oak Hill, Pflugerville) The Travis County Community Centers supports communities through internal and external investments and services. Those in need make an appointment to visit the food pantry and can receive rental and mortgage assistance.

GULF COAST

FOOD BANK OF THE GOLDEN CRESCENT

With more than 100 agencies in 11 county areas on the gulf coast, Food Bank of the Golden Crescent offers programs specific to seniors and kids. In addition to a bi-weekly food bank, money is raised for programs through regular events and farmers markets.

ACROSS THE STATE FEEDING TEXAS

Feeding Texas reaches 254 counties and serves over five million people. In addition to social services outreach, Feeding Texas advocates for public policy changes in favor of those with food insecurity, provides assistance during disaster recovery, helps to advocate for state nutrition programs, and helps eligible families apply for and understand needed assistance.

SAN ANTONIO FOOD BANK

The food bank donates resources, including upskilling and wellness education, to 100,000 individuals per week. In addition to regular farmers markets and fundraising events, the San Antonio Food Bank hosts the annual Turkey Trot 5K to raise money for its programs.

TARRANT AREA FOOD BANK

TAFB serves 13 counties in North Texas, and in 2020, volunteers donated more than 60,000 hours of their time to serve these communities. <u>Volunteers</u> unable to provide time in person are encouraged to host a virtual food drive or donate through grocery shopping donations.

WEST TEXAS FOOD BANK

Using a network of more than 100 partners across 34,000 square miles of Texas, the food bank provides for kids, seniors and families. <u>Volunteers</u> are needed on pantry days and to assemble food and educational kits.
