John Burleson settled in what is modern-day <u>Lampasas</u> in 1850, and today the town is home to nearly 8,000 residents. Although the city was originally named after Burleson, this gateway to Texas Hill Country was eventually renamed "Lampasas Springs" because the city is home to seven mineral springs. The word "Springs" was ultimately removed from the city's name when it was made the seat of Lampasas County.

The two largest of Lampasas' springs produce more than 3,000,000 gallons of water every single day. One of the other springs is now a premier destination for residents and tourists. This free-flow spring pool offers a great way to cool down during our blazing Texas summers.

Lampasas is also home to some great eateries. Many of its dining options specialize in local cuisine or southern-style cooking. A few such examples include Bill's Burgers, L&B Roadhouse BBQ, and Kempner Brick Oven.

This town has several unique dining options as well. The Doghouse Lampasas, Texas Legato, Fiesta Winery, The Beer Kooler,

and the Log Cabin Café are great places to check out while exploring Lampasas.

For those interested in immersing themselves in the culture of Texas Hill Country, Lampasas has plenty to offer. The <u>World's Largest Spur</u> pays homage to Texas cowboys while also serving as a novelty landmark. Tourists in Lampasas can also visit the murals on the back side of the town square or the Lampasas County Museum.


