Hyde Park is one of Austin's most famous neighborhoods. Considered to be part of central Austin, it is located squarely in the city's historic district. Geographically, Hyde Park's western border is defined by Guadalupe Street. Duval Street marks the eastern border. It is also bordered by 45th Street to the north and 38th Street to the south.

Hyde Park's lineup of restaurants and eateries are some of the best in the state. The food options in Austin's historic district run the gamut. A few highlights include <u>Antonelli's Cheese Shop, The Flightpath Coffeehouse, ASTI Trattoria, and NeWorlDeli</u>. History buffs also have plenty of sights to enjoy while in Hyde Park. They can visit locales like the Elisabet Ney Museum, Shipe Park and Pool, and the Moonlight Tower.

Music lovers that reside in or visit Hyde Park gravitate towards the <u>Hyde Park Theatre (HPT)</u>. The HPT routinely hosts up-and-coming musicians. Concert attendees have the opportunity to enjoy the sights and sounds of these musical displays in an intimate and captivating environment.

Each year the residents celebrate the annual <u>Fire Station</u> <u>Festival</u>, which commemorates the saving of Fire Station No. 9 in the Hyde Park neighborhood. The fall fest includes

a parade with costumed marchers and games, music and activities at the fire station.

Those interested in venturing outside the Hyde Park district can experience even more of Austin's entertainment and food options. From high-class restaurants to laid-back bars and everything in between, Austin truly has it all!

During Texas' lengthy warm seasons, Hyde Park residents can visit Lake Austin or Lake Travis. The latter is a massive lake that covers nearly 30 square miles. Lake visitors can take guided boat tours or rent their own vehicles for a leisurely day out on the water.
